Our Guiding Principles - the NDRP seeks to:









Funding Round 1



Topic: Safety of people with disability

All projects will use co-design approaches.

2 streams:

- **1. Co-design research proposals** to use in an application for future research funding.
- 2. Use **knowledge synthesis** methods to bring together what is already known about a topic, and co-produce reports, briefs, guidelines or similar.

Budgets up to \$60,000



✓ payments for people who are not paid a wage for their role in the project

✓ reasonable travel and accommodation costs

✓ costs to host meetings, including catering

✓ aids to support inclusive participation (e.g. Easy Read, Auslan, captioning, interpreters, translation)

✓ some equipment or items to support inclusion and accessibility

✓ training activities (e.g. LGBTQIA+ inclusion training)

Budgets up to \$60,000




Timelines – Grant Round 1

- Form opens 17 March 2025
- Form closes 28 April 2025

Independent panels review and scores applications NDRP leadership chooses projects to fund

- Projects start June/July 2025
- Projects must be finished by May 2026

People in the project





5 key assessment criteria

Impact on policy, practice or programs (25% weighting) – up to 600 words

Impact of the project's process (15% weighting) – up to 600 words

Project methods (30% weighting) – up to 1,000 words

Capacity and resources to deliver the project (30% weighting) – up to 400 words

Overall value and risk (unweighted) – up to 300 words
